Application period:	01/03/2024 – 15/06/2024

*** German Intensive Course/Preparatory Weeks**

Prep Weeks comprise German Intensive Course , enrolment procedure and study preparation. Intensive course: Free comprehensive language and orientation course to improve German skills. Listening and reading comprehension, writing and oral expression, German culture, history and politics. Get to know the campus, the city of Erfurt & its surroundings. Language levels: A1-B1. Upon successful participation, 6 ECTS will be obtained.	
Participants / requirements:	Basic German knowledge is recommendable but not mandatory. Students with intermediate level of German or second-year students of German Studies will not be admitted to the Preparatory Course.
Duration:	4 weeks, Monday to Friday, 80 lessons of German
Prep Weeks Winter Semester 2024/25:	September 2024 (students will be informed about exact dates in time)
Prep Weeks Summer Semester 2025:	March 2025 (students will be informed about exact dates in time)

Formalities

Application:	Deadline winter semesters: June 15 Deadline summer semesters: November 30 Application information and documents to be sent (4 application steps)
Health Insurance:	EU countries: Exchange students must present the European insurance card (EHIC) obtained from their domestic national insurance. Non-EU countries/Countries without bilateral agreement: Health insurances are not recognised . Students must buy statutory health insurance in Germany! Costs for statutory student health insurance: approx. €125/month
Semester Contribution:	Total costs: approx. € 300/semester The student identification card includes the semester ticket which entitles you to travel on the city routes of the Erfurt transport system and on the local trains within Thuringia.

The European Credit Transfer System (ECTS): Recognition of Records

Workload:	30 credit points should be obtained per semester. One ECTS-credit corresponds to one <i>Leistungspunkt</i> (LP = credit point) at the University of Erfurt
