COST OF LIVING IN FLENSBURG

The cost of living is generally slightly lower than in major German cities. Students are recommended to budget for a minimum of 600 € to 700 € monthly, including rent. Breakfast, lunch and snacks are available in the main campus refectory (*Mensa*) open on weekdays from 8:30 to 4:00. The menu includes daily vegetarian dishes.

NON-EU STUDENTS need a VISA FOR GERMANY

All Non-EU students (including students from USA, Brazil and Korea) are required to get a visa to be able to enter the country and to open bank accounts in Germany. This is new. All non-EU students need to have a local bank account to be able to do payments, bank transfers, receive scholarships, etc.
