Abstract: (few lines describing the staff week that SEA-EU partners can use for dissemination)	<p>English is the medium some universities are introducing within existing academic conventions while preparing their national and international students for the professional and working world.</p> <p>The 'English for Academics: EMI, EAP & ESP' Staff Week is designed to raise awareness of what is core to these three 'E's by first introducing the teachers/lecturers to basic intercultural principles which are then applied to workshop sessions on assessment, feedback and spoken delivery in a range of academic scenarios.</p> <p>Three workshops will be organised in the form of input and practice sessions which allow the teachers/lecturers to start from key principles and move on to practising in a safe environment.</p> <p>Attendees are expected to have a minimum competence of B1/B2 in the English language.</p>
